POLLING OVERVIEW BY NOPC (May 2021)

- A nationwide survey gauging support for 30x30 <u>conducted by ALG Research</u> in January 2021 found:
 - Four out of five voters favor 30x30 because they understand it will improve our economy and our health.
 - By a ratio of more than 2-to-1, voters think this would be good for the economy.
- Public opinion research conducted by Hart Research Associates and commissioned by the
 Center for American Progress found that <u>86 percent of voters</u> in the United States—including
 strong bipartisan majorities—support setting a national 30x30 goal. 54 percent strongly support
 a national 30x30 goal.
 - Similarly, <u>nearly three-quarters of voters</u> think protecting 30% of American lands and waters by 2030 is an achievable goal. 67 percent of voters think we could, over time, achieve protections for at least 50% of all lands and ocean.
- The 2021 Conservation in the West annual poll found that 77 percent of voters in eight Western states—Arizona, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, New Mexico, Nevada, Utah, and Wyoming—support a national 30x30 goal. 82 percent of Native American voters, 83 percent of Latino voters, and 90 percent of African American voters in these states support protecting 30% of our lands and ocean by 2030.
- Public opinion research from Packard and Kantor found that <u>95 percent of people</u> in the United
 States support establishing marine protected areas.
